Classroom or conference center workshop activities are held in facilities that are ADA approved and accessible for the physically impaired. Universal design is utilized for classroom and conference programming in order to accommodate different learning styles and impairments. An ASL translator will be provided, if the need is brought to NFCA's attention with sufficient notice.

The GREAT on-line learning programs will be available with an audio translation for the visually impaired if the participant does not have access to a Text to Speech computer system, or if it is preferred. Testing may be offered in different formats to accommodate different learning styles or learning disabilities. For example, the post-test may be offered verbally over the telephone, if requested.
